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2023 Annual Report Snapshot

As we reflect on the accomplishments of the past year, I am thrilled to share the progress we have made together in advancing the mission of Erin's House. In 2023, we began our capital campaign for The Wing, expanded our support in schools and community organizations, celebrated 30 years of service, and continued to provide the community with grief programs, camps, resources, and education, all free of charge.

The Wing | Grief Resources for Young Adults

We began our capital campaign last year and are so grateful to have raised \$1.1 million from the generous giving of individuals, foundations, and businesses in our community. The Wing will soon

be an amazing addition and expansion to our Erin's House services to support ages 18-25. Through 2024, we continue this capital campaign to raise a total of \$2.3 million—all to make The Wing a reality for our young adults.

Expanding Support in Schools

In 2023, Erin's House extended its reach and impact by providing grief support to over 800 students in schools and local organizations through our Classroom Companions and Identity Outreach programs. These initiatives have been instrumental in ensuring that students in elementary, middle, and high schools receive the care and support they need, even when they can't make it to Erin's House.

Lilly Endowment Grant

With a \$1 million grant we received from Lilly Endowment, we will be investing in staff development, increased outreach initiatives, additional Erin's House transportation, and much more over the next three years. Support like this helps Erin's House to thrive and think outside of the box on big improvements and changes to enhance our organization.



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

Laura Huhn, Mom

Losing my mom when I was just thirteen turned my world upside down. While she was walking our dog, she was hit by a car and it left me completely shocked. I'll never forget the moment I passed the accident on my way home from a volleyball game, knowing deep down in my heart that it was her. The panic set in when I arrived home, and it was my grandma who gently broke the news.

Not long after her death, my dad and older sister took me to Erin's House. I remember the pizza dinners and bouncing around in the Volcano Room as my favorite parts. Through the supportive community and open communication, Erin's House normalized my grief, showing me I wasn't alone for losing my mom. Surrounded by peers who shared similar experiences, I felt understood in a way I hadn't at school. Recalling that sense of belonging all these years later had been on my heart for a long time. I finally decided to take the leap to volunteer with the organization that had supported me in a challenging time in my life. Erin's House is such a great cause and it felt so good to come back and begin supporting others.

At each start of program, we begin with opening circle where we introduce ourselves and our person who died. I have really enjoyed seeing the kids let their guard down in groups each week knowing they're in a safe space. It feels like a full circle moment that I'm back at Erin's House talking about my mom again, now with the purpose of helping kids with their grief. I get to share the feelings I felt when my mom died and it normalizes all the experiences the kids in my 6-to-9 age group are feeling too.

For many people, grief can be an awkward or uncomfortable subject in that we don't know what to say when someone else experiences death. It can be even more challenging for a child to feel like an outsider to their peers after a death. Erin's House helps children feel like they belong and feel understood.

One thing I think is important for people to know about Erin's House is that it's not all sadness. There's so much laughter, play, and happy memories being made there, just how I remembered it. It's ultimately a safe and fun place for kids to show up as they are with their emotions to be comforted and understood by all.

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The Identity Program

The Identity program and our Outreach initiative began with a grant and a vision to support youth through off-site programs.

Youth who experience unresolved grief without adequate support are more prone to substance abuse, academic struggles, depression, anxiety, and difficulties in maintaining healthy relationships. We recognized that, in certain areas of our community, the need for grief services was present and the services of Erin's House were unknown. We couldn't let these setbacks of local youth who are grieving go unnoticed.

The Identity Outreach Program officially came to fruition through a New York Life Foundation grant in 2018 and was born with a clear plan: to provide Erin's House services to youth in areas of our community where there is an increased rate of violence, tragedy, and death.

Just like on-site programs at Erin's House, the Identity program tackles the impact of unresolved grief by offering customized peer-support sessions and engaging activities. Through a nurturing environment, group activities give participants the ability to express themselves with peers similar to them who have also experienced a death. Additionally, through collaborative efforts with organizations like The Euell Wilson Center, Fort Wayne Parks Community Centers, and The Renaissance YMCA, we are able to meet youth in their local spaces when they are available. As Identity has grown, we've seen a growing number of youth who are actively involved and working towards healing.

400 children & 90 programs provided annually

Erick T. Baker, Director of Community Outreach, has led Identity since its inception.

"I have personally witnessed children in every program begin to learn and accept their grief. Over time they realize that, with their grief, they have a responsibility to themselves and others to direct their emotions and feelings in a positive way. Many children and teens who have been a part of the program now identify the importance of seeking support. The valuable tools learned in program groups allow participants to know that they have ownership over their future with grief."

The top priority of Identity is providing free grief services to underserved areas of our community. Secondarily, we aim to inform and guide our youth and their families to ultimately join on-site programs at Erin's House for a consistent 10 weeks of healing together.

As we continue to expand our support services and spread the mission of Erin's House, we remain committed to advocating for the well-being of all youth whether they're able to make it on-site or not. We strive to create a future where every young person has the resources and peer support they need to thrive beyond their grief.

Just like all Erin's House services, Identity is provided at no cost to youth or partnering organizations.

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The Wing Groundbreaking

The Wing's groundbreaking ceremony on May 3, 2024, marked a new chapter for the community and the mental health of young adults who have experienced a death. At the ceremony were smiling faces from the Farragh family, board members, volunteers, staff, foundations, and supporters as shovels broke ground to the beginning of grief support for ages 18 to 25 at Erin's House.

The new facility adds 29% more program space for peer-support services, with an anticipated 15% annual growth rate, despite being the hardest age group to get to walk through our doors. The building is planned to be completed this fall, with services commencing in the winter.

The Notre Dame Dick Corbett Head Football Coach, Marcus Freeman, and Cornerback Jaden Mickey were featured speakers this year at the Common Bond fundraiser.
